Dear Customer.,

Conflict Minerals refer to the illegal extraction and control of minerals from DRC (Democratic Republic of Congo) or adjoining countries.

For over a decade, the trade in conflict minerals has fueled human right abuses and promoted insecurity

In eastern DRC. The securities and exchange commission (SEC) adopted The Dodd-Frank Wall Street reform and Consumer Protection Act, passed by the US

Congress in July 2010, includes a provision-section 1502 aimed at stopping the national army and rebel group in the DRC from illegal using profits from the mineral trade to fund their fight.

The regulatory law reform directed the Commission to issue rules requiring certain companies to disclose their use of conflict minerals that include Tantalum, Tin, Gold or Tungsten if those minerals are necessary for functionality or production as a product manufactured by those companies.

We have inform our supplier, to assist us to obtain source information to determine from Smelter and refiners of minerals in their supply chain, materials or products contain or not contain Minerals that originate from DRC.


We are asking for their support in our effort to help with the reporting obligation under Dodd-Frank,
